### 2025 School Excellence Plan

Comprehensive evaluative practices have shaped the formulation of the Panania Public School Excellence Plan (SEP) 2025. Areas of focus are as follows:

# Strategic Direction 1: Quality evidence informed programs and data practices

Deepen teacher understanding of the research and pedagogy underpinning syllabus documentation. Teach, assess and report using the English K-10 syllabus, Mathematics K-10 syllabus, HSIE K-6 syllabus, and PDHPE K-6 syllabus, and to evaluate in regular cycles to refine new practices and improve student outcomes.



### **Strategic Direction 2: Wellbeing and positive partnerships**

Whole school approach to student engagement with cohesive integration and implementation of inclusive wellbeing strategies regarding:

### **Strategic Direction 3: Collaborative Learning Culture**

Strengthen Panania Public School's learning community and enhance the development of teachers as leaders that are adaptive in solving complex learning problems.



### **Explicit Teaching English K-2**

Evidence informed program, Initial Lit has been introduced across our K-2 classes to support and enhance explicit teaching. It includes a systematic synthetic phonic component, as well as a rich literature component. The phonic component will teach children the alphabetic code for reading and spelling. The literature component will develop children's vocabulary, comprehension, oral language skills and





reading fluency. Students are reportedly enjoying the shared texts, new vocabulary introduced and creative tasks.

Children's school work & class behaviour can be greatly improved through karate's disciplined training environment.


